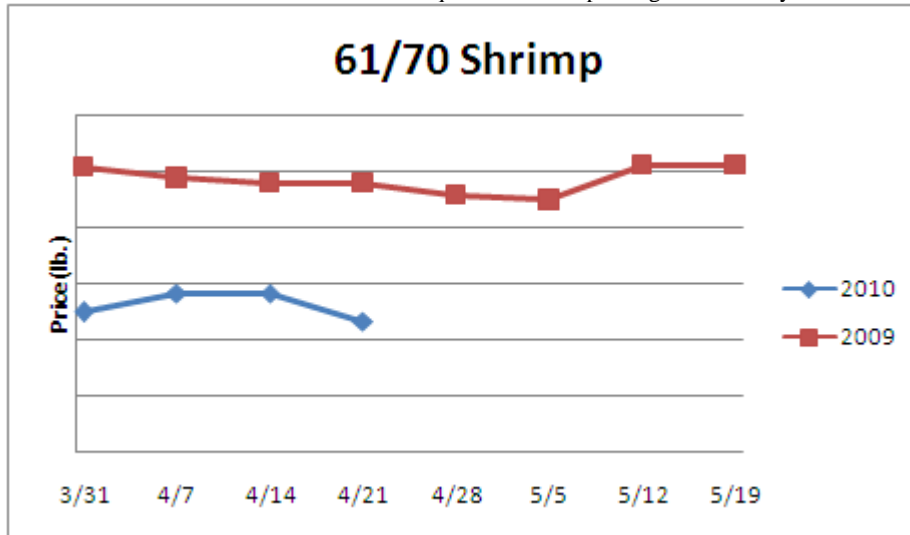


# Seafood Report

**Seafood-** Winter US Gulf of Mexico shrimp landings are estimated to have been 16% smaller than the previous year. Elevated fuel prices could continue to restrict US shrimp fishing as 2010 progresses. The shrimp markets are mostly firm. The snow crab leg markets are trending upward. Additional snow crab leg market increases may be forthcoming due to the overall reduction in the Canadian quota and an improving US economy.
